AFTH Provides

- All services free of charge to expectant parents
- In-person counseling to you regarding your unplanned pregnancy, at a location of your choice
- A social worker with whom you can build a trusting relationship and maintain contact with as often as you wish

AFTH Assists with

- Securing prenatal care and scheduling appointments
- Providing transportation for pregnancy-related appointments
- Obtaining medical assistance, WIC, food stamps, and other benefits
- Identifying your preferences and choosing an adoptive family accordingly

AFTH Coordinates

- Pre-placement meetings between you and the adoptive family
- With the hospital and its staff of your adoption plan, and advocates for your wishes during your hospital stay
- Daily contact with you during your hospital stay
- Visits between you and the adoptive family at the hospital if requested
- Support at court hearings if the court requires your attendance

AFTH Facilitates

- In-person ongoing post-placement counseling and support groups
- The exchange of ongoing correspondence
- Post-placement visits between you and the adoptive family
