Happy Social Work Month



A Heartfelt Donation from a Birth Mother



For those worried or scared about the new US policy reversals and changes, we want to assure you that Adoptions From The Heart will continue to stand behind our core values of C.H.O.I.C.E.S.

- Communication Listen well, be clear, respectful and inspiring
- Honesty Be truthful and sincere
- **Opportunity** Opportunity for growth and development
- **Integrity** Make decisions that are consistent with the agency mission
- Creativity Use imagination to transcend traditional ideas and create meaningful new ideas
- **Equality** Treat all clients, employees, and their families with respect and dignity regardless of race, religion, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, income level or title.
- **Support** Support people's choices regarding family planning.

We have support groups for LGBTQ+ families that we encourage families to join as we navigate new and proposed laws.

We will continue to respect and use pronouns for families looking to place children and those waiting to adopt.

We will continue to be supportive and non-judgmental toward families seeking to place children for adoption and offer no-pressure options.

We will be looking for resources to provide educational information to answer immigration questions for those who have adopted internationally and are worried about their children's immigration status.

We will continue to educate families who are adopting transracially to be more prepared to navigate this changing culture while raising a child of a different race.

We will continue to encourage families of color to adopt to be able to provide choices of diverse families to expectant parents considering adoption.

Triangle Time: Building Community & Connection

The first two Triangle Time sessions in Wynnewood were a resounding success. Led by Jacquelyn Fagioli—an adoptive parent and educator—this in-person gathering for placed adoptive families provided a warm and engaging space for connection, learning, and fun.

The first session welcomed eight families, who sat together for music, dancing, and a reading of "Tell Me Again About the Night I Was Born". Jacquelyn facilitated meaningful discussions, encouraging parents to share their adoption stories in a natural and comforting way. She also surprised each child with a baby doll representing diverse racial backgrounds, adding a special touch to the experience.

The second session saw an even greater turnout, with families from multiple offices joining in. The room was alive with songs, stories, crafts, and conversation. A highlight of the session was a balloon craft symbolizing the adoption triad, offering families a new way to represent their connections beyond the traditional tree and roots model.

With four sessions planned for this trial year, Triangle Time is proving to be a valuable resource for adoptive families looking to build community. One family was so moved by the experience that they immediately registered for all remaining 2025 sessions.

A huge thank you to Jacquelyn for her dedication and creativity, and to Sheila for bringing her warmth and energy to the group. We look forward to the next session in May 2025 and hope to expand this program to more AFTH locations. If you know families who might be interested, please help us spread the word.

Celebrating Stephanie Capriotti

At Adoptions From The Heart (AFTH), we are privileged to have many devoted social workers on our team. This month, we celebrate Stephanie Capriotti, AFTH's longest-serving social worker, whose passion and dedication have left a lasting impact on countless lives.

Stephanie's Journey into Social Work



Stephanie's path to social work was not linear. She began her studies at Lebanon Valley College in Pennsylvania as a pre-med student, eager to work with and help people. However, she soon realized that doctors often don't get as much hands-on interaction with patients as she desired. Upon discussing this with a professor, she was encouraged

to explore social work-and it was a perfect fit.

During her studies, Stephanie took an adoption course that sparked her interest in the field. The professor teaching the course was an adoptive mother and a board member at AFTH. She encouraged Stephanie to apply for a social work position at AFTH's newly opened Harrisburg office. Already familiar with the agency through her cousin's adoption, Stephanie applied, interviewed, and landed the job just weeks before graduating. As she puts it, "the rest was history!"

A Career Rooted in Passion

Stephanie has been with AFTH for 24 years—more than half of the agency's 40-year history. She attributes the agency's success to its unwavering commitment to its mission, saying:

"We've never really lost sight of what Maxine truly wanted when she started the agency. So, I think that has just been our core and sort of our foundation in that openness is the most important thing. We never lost sight of making sure that for all the parties involved, we're doing what's in the best interest of them and the adoptees at the end of the day."

Over the years, Stephanie has witnessed significant growth at AFTH, particularly in the education and support services available to adoptive and birth parents. While counseling has always been a requirement, she notes that it has expanded to become an ongoing process. The introduction of various support groups for all members of the adoption triad—birth parents, adoptees, and adoptive parents—has also been a highlight of AFTH's evolution.

A Leader and Mentor

Stephanie has advanced in her career, now serving as the Adoption Counselor & District Supervisor of the

Central Pennsylvania office. While she still works closely with families, she also mentors and guides new social workers, helping them find their strengths and niche within the agency. Transitioning from handson social work to supervision required learning to step back and allow others to develop their own approaches. She finds it rewarding to watch new social



workers grow in their roles, bringing fresh perspectives to the agency's mission.

Through her years at AFTH, Stephanie has learned that patience and empathy are key. She explains that each person processes adoption differently, and it's essential to respect individual timelines and needs:

"There are so many processes at play in adoption the hospital process, the legal process. It's crucial to remain patient and empathetic with families, allowing individuals space in these life-changing moments to make the best decision for them and their children."

After 24 years, Stephanie's passion for adoption and dedication to AFTH remain as strong as ever. She has been a pillar of support for so many families, ensuring they receive the guidance and compassion they need. Her unwavering commitment makes her an invaluable part of the AFTH community.

Terry and Jared's Adoption Journey:

A Story of Love, Patience, and Hope

Terry and Jared always knew they wanted to become parents. From the early days of their relationship, they envisioned a future filled with love, laughter, and the joy of raising a child together. Adoption had always been on their hearts as the right path to growing their family, and after researching different agencies, they were drawn to AFTH. Hearing firsthand experiences from friends who had worked with AFTH, they felt confident that this was the agency that could help them make their dreams a reality.

Embracing Adoption with Open Hearts



As an interracial couple, Terry and Jared felt a deep connection to the idea of adopting a biracial child. They wanted their future child to feel embraced, understood, and supported in their identity.

Their circle of friends, many of whom were part of interracial families themselves, became an essential source of inspiration and reassurance. They knew that their child would grow up with a strong sense of belonging, surrounded by people who shared similar backgrounds and experiences. Their extended family also played a crucial role, offering unwavering support and affirmations that their child's unique heritage would always be honored and cherished.

While their hearts were full of excitement, the waiting period proved to be one of the most challenging aspects of their journey.

"The unknown is the hardest part," Terry admits. "There were moments of doubt, anxiety, and the emotional rollercoaster of not knowing when we would be matched."

To cope with the stress and uncertainty, Terry

and Jared found comfort in keeping busy. They immersed themselves in hobbies, spent time with loved ones, and leaned on each other for support. They also connected with other waiting families through AFTH, finding solace in shared experiences and the reassurance that they were not alone.

The Life-Changing Moment

After months of waiting, the moment they had been dreaming of finally arrived—they were selected by a birth parent. The news filled them with overwhelming joy and gratitude.

"We were over the moon," they recall. "It was surreal to know that we were finally taking the next step toward parenthood."

Jared offers heartfelt advice to other hopeful adoptive parents navigating the waiting process:

"Try not to overthink, and stop negative thought cycles before they spiral. It's so easy to go down a black hole, but you have to trust that your time will come."

As their journey unfolded, Jared found himself deeply moved by the strength and courage of their child's birth parent.

"I wasn't prepared for the wave of emotions I felt on their behalf," he shares. "The bravery it takes to make such a selfless decision is something I will always hold immense respect for."

The experience deepened their understanding of adoption as a journey built on love—not just their love for their child, but the love and sacrifice of the birth parents as well.

Today, they cherish every moment with their child, knowing that their family was brought together through a beautiful act of love and connection.

Their story serves as an inspiration to all hopeful adoptive parents: no matter how long or uncertain the road may seem, the joy of finally holding your child in your arms makes every challenge along the way worthwhile.

Help Us Adopt offers grants six times per year, giving families multiple opportunities to secure financial assistance. The next application deadline is May 3rd, making now the perfect time for prospective adoptive parents to apply.

During a recent call with founder Becky Fawcett, she emphasized the importance of persistence. She strongly encourages families to apply for each grant cycle while they wait for placement. If a family does not receive a grant during one cycle, they should continue applying, as the selection process varies each time.



How to Apply

Applying for a grant through Help Us Adopt is a straightforward process. Interested families can find detailed information and application guidelines on their website.

Domestic Program Update

Happy National Social Worker Month (March). We celebrate our AFTH Social Workers, Counselors, Case Workers, and Social Workers worldwide for their dedication, hard work, and commitment to families. Your efforts, especially in times of uncertainty and limited resources, are deeply appreciated. We hope each of you takes time to recognize your impact this month.

AFTH Social Workers, your work is valued; from counseling expectant parents on their options to "on call" time for emergency (and planned!) placements on nights, weekends, and holidays. From completing outreach in our community to ensure we know local resources for clients and local resources know about our services to hosting education courses, series, and support groups. From writing home studies, dictations, and reports following state regulations to agency wide meetings and participating in events. We appreciate all you do for AFTH families and the teamwork you have all shown.

We have seen an increase in adolescent and adult adoptees reaching out about questions about their background and biological connections and identity. As adoptive parents, showing our children that we honor their identity, biological family, history, and culture is crucial to creating a secure attachment and trusting relationship with your children; the hope is that they will come to their adoptive families for support and encouragement when searching for birth families. We have many educational opportunities available to learn more about navigating this throughout your child's life. Please see education opportunities on page 4 and page 11 for more information if you are struggling with openness please reach out to your local offices to help you navigate keeping the promises made to your child and their birth families.

Agency Waiting Statistics

Over the years, we have observed a significant reduction in the number of families experiencing extended wait times of over two years for placement. While extended waits can still pose challenges for those affected, our current wait time statistics are notably lower compared to other agencies offering domestic adoption services.

As of March 1st, 82% of our waiting families have been waiting less than 2 years, 63% of AFTH's waiting families have been waiting for 18 months or less and 39% a year or less.

Emergency Placement Statistics

In the past fiscal year, 71% of placements have been emergencies. Please have a plan ready for children in the home, pets, car/travel, and your home in case you get "the call" and need to be states away within 24 hours!

Help Us Adopt Grants

Help Us Adopt awards grants of up to \$30,000 to help cover the costs associated with adoption. Their mission is to support families of all backgrounds without discrimination, ensuring that more children find their forever homes.
