National Adoption Month Series: Meet Nicole Fowler

About Nicole Fowler's Role and Work at AFTH:



Nicole is the Director of Social Services for Adoptions From The Heart, District Supervisor for Virginia, and Regional Supervisor for AFTH's Allentown & Connecticut offices. In this role, Fowler focuses on the development of educational courses, learning how to best suit the needs of all, current and future, AFTH families. She is dedicated to being a support for all team members, while working to be a lifeline to the team when challenges arise.

Nicole first came to AFTH over 15 years ago. Since then, she has learned that there is so much that goes into making an adoption plan, and she values the courage needed to make such plan. Understanding the gains and losses the adoption triad experiences, while boosting up the adoptee is a big inspiration to the work that she does. "Thinking of the children that are placed for adoption [is what keeps me motivated]," Fowler told us.

When it comes to her goals for AFTH, Fowler hopes to put an emphasis on education and support for all members of the adoption triad, and those considering adoption. "I want to have the best families and social workers to work with those that are considering adoption. I trust and believe in our program so much, that I want [families] to find us," she shared.

Since Nicole started as an intern and moved to administration, she has done a lot with AFTH. Now she focuses on the macro-level of AFTH as a whole. After 10+ years of casework, Fowler uses her experience to develop programming and works to review cases alongside the team, while supervising social services. She shared that she is constantly taking in new information through books and other media in order to educate herself.

As mentioned above, Nicole is all about education and this is why AFTH's educational resources are so important to her. When asked about AFTH's educational resources, Nicole shared that AFTH focuses much attention on educating about the fundamental aspects of adoption, leading adoptees to feel more comfortable and confident with their identity. Classes are available that focus on intersectionality, transracial adoption, and nonnewborn adoption, among others. Educational series feature panels, lectures, and information for families considering adoption.

When it comes to advice, this is what Nicole has to say to perspective adoptiove parents: there are so many ways to go about adoption. "It takes time," Fowler shared. It is important to connect with other members of the adoption triad to hear their stories. For expectant parents, it is important to have local support. Working with an agency that believes in open adoption and will provide services postadoption planning is crucial to feel supported.

The Importance of National Adoption Month:



National Adoption Month is a time to celebrate everyone who has experienced the adoption process. There are positive and negative experiences in the process of adoption, but we need to share those stories to boost everyone up.

Always continue sharing information from those who have lived through adoption. "We all have to educate ourselves but listening and having a platform for all to share their experiences [allows people to feel confident and comfortable to speak out]."

Navigating The Unexpected: Morgan's Path to Open Adoption



When Morgan stepped into the hospital, she found herself in labor, completely unaware she was pregnant. While faced with the decision to parent her son, Morgan found strength, guidance, and support from Adoptions From The Heart (AFTH), alongside the hospital staff. Her journey went from fear, uncertainty, and

confusion to a place of hope and confidence. Morgan's experience provides a first-hand glimpse into the impact of compassionate adoption support provided by AFTH.

Morgan's story is unique. In the hospital, with no prior knowledge of her pregnancy, she was presented with two options for placing her child for adoption: a law firm and AFTH. Morgan called AFTH, and Amanda Aliberti, Adoption From The Heart's Birthparent Services Manager, answered the phone in the middle of the night. From that first conversation, Morgan felt a sense of comfort due to the support system Amanda had begun to put in place.

Morgan recalls how Amanda walked her through each step with genuine compassion and clarity. "Just the way [Amanda] talked to me, I knew it would all be okay," Morgan said. Initially, she leaned toward a closed adoption, fearing the open adoption requirements and processes. However, with the guidance of Amanda, the hospital nurses, and her other social worker, Christian Mayer, Morgan began to open herself to the idea of an open adoption. "I was nervous about connecting to a family," she admitted, but the ongoing communication and reassurance helped her make a choice that benefitted her and her son.

Placing a child for adoption is an emotional journey, especially when you do not know that you are pregnant. As Morgan was unaware she was going to be giving birth, she recalls, "A lot of emotions [in such a short amount of time]."

Morgan, already parenting one child, decided to

work with AFTH and selected one of the longestwaiting families. When she finally found a family for her son, she reminded herself, "This is all about love and protection of a child," and knew in her heart, "He was meant to be with them."

Although her initial thought was to opt for a closed adoption, the support and resources from AFTH helped shift that mindset. "At first, I thought a closed adoption would be the best option. But, it really wasn't." She cherishes the open relationship she now has with the adoptive family, watching them grow and maintaining a loving connection with her son as his "bonus person." Morgan encourages adoptive families to keep an open line of communication and try to incorporate the birthparent into the child's life.

For Morgan, the support she received from Adoptions From The Heart extended far beyond placement. "Every time I text [my social workers], they are more than happy to respond," she shared. AFTH's birth parent support group became a critical space for Morgan to connect, share, and cope with others who understood. "You get to watch this family grow," she says of her son's adoptive family. Her gratitude for their openness and love is immense. "I am more grateful to them for being so amazing."

Morgan emphasizes that her journey is a story of love. Her hope is that every adoptive parent maintains open communication and offers opportunities for birth parents to remain a part of their children's lives. "There are a lot of children that need to be loved," Morgan states, and she encourages others navigating this path not to lose hope in the process. Morgan enjoys receiving photos and updates from her adoptive family. The family has also maintained excellent open communication with Morgan, even sending her gifts to share their appreciation and love.

Morgan's journey is just one example of how compassionate adoption support and open adoption can provide so much to an individual. From fear and uncertainty, she found love, support, and community. Her story is a reminder that even the most unexpected journeys can lead to hope, strength, and meaningful connections.

Cat's Adoption Story and Reflections on Identity

When we talk about adoption, we often explore themes of family, identity, and resilience. For Cat, being adopted was not a revelation that came at a particular moment but rather a fact she was raised knowing. "I never really found out," she said. "It was never a secret." Growing up as the only adopted person in her family, Cat recalls an overwhelmingly positive experience filled with love and support. Her adoptive family, a close-knit unit, made her feel right at home with her brother, a biological child. "It never was a secretive, negative thing," she shared. This early openness about her story shaped how she perceived adoption—not as something to hide but as a unique and valued part of her identity.

Though she didn't know her birth family personally while growing up, Cat stayed connected to her birth mother through letters each year. This annual correspondence gave her a tangible connection to her roots, and she had photos that marked the beginnings of her story. She learned about her birth mother's background: a young woman in college, who, though she initially tried to raise her, decided adoption was the best path to ensure a better life.

For Cat, adoption was always "a cool, fun, and interesting fact" about herself. Growing up, she had friends who were also adoptees, which made the experience feel even more "normal." Although she occasionally wondered about her biological roots

when she was younger, her primary focus was on the family she had—the one that had embraced her from infancy. As she grew older, any questions she had took a back seat to the present relationships and strong bonds with her adoptive family.

Cat's adoptive journey has influenced not only her outlook on family but also her goals and dreams. Her mother, who owns Heart & Soul'd Thrift Store, inspired Cat's desire to give back. This legacy of compassion and service is something she values deeply, and she now has the opportunity to share her experience with her younger cousin, who is also adopted. "I get to help her with any questions about being adopted, so it is special," Cat reflected.

For those struggling with identity, Cat's advice is to "look at the overall picture." She acknowledges that grappling with identity can be challenging, especially when the past feels uncertain. But Cat believes there's beauty in every adoption story. She says, "Even though I know biologically that I'm not hers, my mom shaped me so much into the woman I am today." This sentiment highlights Cat's belief that family is not solely defined by biology but by the shared experiences that create lasting bonds.

A New In-Person Resource for Adoptive Families

Triangle Time Launches in Wynnewood.

On Saturday, November 9, 2024, Adoptions From The Heart's Wynnewood office proudly hosted its first-ever Triangle Time session for placed adoptive parents and their children. This exciting new program brought families together in a warm and supportive setting to connect, learn, and share experiences.

Jacquelyn Fagioli, an adoptive mom via transracial adoption and an educator, led the session with an extraordinary blend of energy, positivity, and thoughtfulness. Drawing on her personal and professional experience, Jacquelyn carefully designed the program to incorporate key adoption-related concepts in a way that felt engaging and natural for both parents and children. Her efforts were a resounding success, creating a welcoming adoption community for all who attended.

Highlights of the Event

- Strong Attendance: Eight families joined the session, sitting together on floor mats for a cozy and interactive experience.
- Interactive Activities: Jacquelyn led the group through music, dancing, and storytelling. A highlight of the session was a reading of Tell Me Again About the Night I Was Born by Jamie Lee Curtis.
- *Personal Storytelling:* Using the book as a springboard, parents shared snippets of their adoption stories with their children in a gentle and accessible way.
- *Thoughtful Surprises:* Each child received a surprise bag containing a baby doll, carefully chosen to represent diverse racial backgrounds, adding a special and meaningful touch to the day.

This inaugural session was part of a yearlong pilot program, with four sessions planned through 2025. The overwhelmingly positive feedback suggests Triangle Time could become a long-term resource for families.

AFTH Holiday Closure

AFTH offices will be closed for the holidays starting at 4pm on Friday, December 20th and re-opening on Thursday, January 2nd. Social workers will be available to hospitals for emergency placements during the break and will continue working with women who may deliver during that time.

We recognize, and do not celebrate, the losses and grief that come with adoption, but believe in our program and families enough to wish that every parent considering adoption finds our agency for support and services. We want to work with our communities to gather information that is helpful to our clients and will also reach others with our information. We believe in the power and heart that goes into having openness with children in adoption, regardless of circumstances. We appreciate all who have joined us in this; your support, evaluations, and constructive feedback are taken into esteemed consideration.

New contracts and policies will be going out early December, please get these back to your Social Worker by the due date to avoid a hold on profiles. Profiles will go on hold if there is a delay in return and we want as many families to be active as possible over the holidays!

The Wait During The Holidays

We recognize the holidays can be a particularly difficult time in the "waiting" part of the adoption journey. We offer many different supports in forms of groups or one-on-one meetings to discuss the "what if's", "how to talk to family members and friends", frustrations, joys, questions, concerns! Please do not suffer in silence, make connections in your supporting community now! Please see information throughout this newsletter and connect with your Social Worker for ideas. In addition, we always look forward to connecting families to support through events such as our picnics and Education Series.

Emergency Placement Statistics

Since the beginning of the year, 63% of placements have been emergencies. Please have a plan ready for children in the home, pets, car/travel, and your home in case you get "the call" and need to be states away within 24 hours!

Families picked for emergency placements have a lot to process in a short period of time and so it's important for families to understand the expectations for them at the hospital. You might have questions about what to and not to do in an emergency placement. If you would like a refresher "preparedness" flyer with ideas from adoptive parents who have been there before, please contact your Social Worker.



Agency Waiting Statistics

Over the years, we have observed a significant reduction in the number of families experiencing extended wait times of over two years for placement. In the past, it was not uncommon for some families to remain active for three or even four years. While extended waits can still pose challenges for those affected, our current wait time statistics are notably lower compared to other agencies offering domestic adoption services.

As of November 1st, 67% of AFTH's waiting families have been waiting for 18 months or less and 54% a year or less.

Adoptee Support Group Continues To Grow

This year, we proudly launched the Adoptee Support Group, a collaborative effort led by adoptees and social workers Christian Mayer from our Wynnewood office and Jackie Zausner from our New Jersey office. The group has welcomed adoptees aged 15 and older, providing a safe and supportive space for them to share their experiences, feelings, and stories with others who understand their journey.

As we look ahead to 2025, our goal is to expand the group and reach even more adoptees who can benefit from this vital platform. If you are an adoptee aged 15 or older, or if you know someone who might find this group helpful, we encourage you to share this information with them.

Dates for the 2025 sessions are already available on the AFTH Calendar of Events. We hope to see new and returning members as we continue fostering connection and support within the adoptee community.





During the holiday season, AFTH receives gifts to forward along to members of the adoption triad. When doing this, we request that adoptive families include funds to cover the postage to repackage and send the gift from our office to their child's birth family.

A friendly reminder: The December 1st deadline is fast approaching! To allow for any potential mail delays, please ensure all packages are delivered to the office by Friday, December 1st.

Gifts received after this date cannot be guaranteed to ship before AFTH's holiday closing.

We also ask that packages remain under 5-7 pounds and 12 inches. With packages of this size, AFTH is able to stamp these from the office and avoid traveling to post offices. We suggest gifts such as photos, books, jewelry, artwork, gift cards, etc. If you have a package that is much heavier, please call the local office you are sending the package to. Our local offices have UPS accounts and can give you a price to ship this way.

The Importance of Obtaining Certificates of Citizenship



In light of recent reports, international adoptees in the U.S. face risks of deportation due to incomplete or missing citizenship documentation, an issue that underscores the critical importance of adoptive parents ensuring proper filing of Certificates of Citizenship.

Thousands of intercountry adoptees in the U.S. face deportation due to a lack of citizenship caused by

legal oversights. Despite being adopted by American families, many didn't receive automatic citizenship. The Adoptee Citizenship Act of 2024 aims to address this loophole. Advocacy remains vital, highlighting the need for compassionate immigration policy and recognizing adoptees' rights as American family members.

As a new administration prepares to take office in January, adoption advocacy groups stress the need for families to verify and address citizenship documentation early to avoid potential complications for adoptees.
