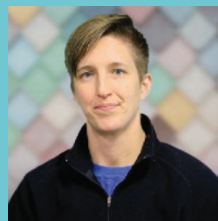
## **Open Adoption Realities: Navigating the Impact on Birth Parents When Agreements Unravel**
