# AFTH Holiday Gift Cards Help 64 Children and 31 Birth Mothers


In December, AFTH donated nearly \$13,000 in gift cards to birth parents who facing financial hurdles during the holiday season.

A highlight for our staff each year is being able to hand deliver gift cards to birth parents in need. Our social workers often say how heartwarming it is to deliver the gift card. Many wished the generous donors could see the heartfelt reactions from the recipients.

Joan Smith, social worker from AFTH Pittsburgh Office, described a phone call from a birth mother on the day she received the gift card:

She was so surprised and completely astounded that we thought to send her a gift for Christmas. She said that no one has ever done this for her and she had been really worried that she wouldn't be able to get anything for her son. She said we are like her guardian angels! She is very thankful that we understand how difficult life can be and she felt so happy to have our help.

A social worker from our Central PA Office handed delivered giftcards to a birthmother. When she first opened it she was speechless. Then, through her tears she explained how grateful she was:



"You have no idea what the agency has done for my family! My boys will now have the Christmas I could not give them. Thank you so much!"



# **AFTH's Birth Parent Scholarship Fund**

## Deadline for Fall Semester - July 1st

Established in the summer of 2014, the AFTH Birth Parent Scholarship Fund has provided scholarships to 14 birth mothers and fathers. From mathematics and conflict management, to communication and assisting the homeless and at-risk youth, the scholarship winners are working hard to pursue their dreams and make a difference in their own lives and the lives of others.

AFTH's Scholarship Committee meets twice a year to review applicants and award scholarships. The deadline for scholarship applicants for the Fall semester is July 1st. Eligible candidates include men and women who have placed children for adoption since 1985, and are currently enrolled in a college or trade school. Applicants are not required to have worked with AFTH. Candidates must also demonstrate financial need and submit an essay regarding their adoption story. Scholarship winners are able to re-apply for up to 8 semesters.

## 5th Annual Find Her Footing 5K - SUPER Successful

## Over 250 Supporters Came Out to Raise Over \$6,500 to Help Expecting & Birth Parents

On Sunday April 2nd, over 250 people came out in support for AFTH's 5th Annual Find Her Footing 5K. Once again the event was held at the Delaware County Community College in Media, Pa.

It was a team effort with more than 140 runners, 50+ staff & volunteers, and a crowd of family and friends cheering on the participants. The 1 Mile Super Fun Run was new this year and its Super Hero theme turned out to be a big hit! The themed run paid homage to Clark Kent; better known as Superman and his adoption story. Runners and walkers donned their favorite superhero attire and soared their way to the finish line. Superman even made a surprise appearance.

The morning began with a bit of a chill but soon warmed up as runners began to check in for the event. We had over 200 assorted bagels, a banana stand and limeade stand for runners to enjoy before and after the race. Since this year's theme was "Superman was adopted too", we had justice league and other super hero props for photos prior to the race.

Before runners took their mark at the starting line, our mini superheroes got a chance to run like the wind in the Kid's Dash, which was a short sprint around a loop. Afterwards, they each received certificates, superhero masks and superhero lollipops! After the race, they celebrated their victories by flying high in the moon bounce, provided by Boing Bouncy House Rentals!

In addition, one of AFTH's amazing birth mothers, Imani addressed the crowd and spoke of the importance of the Expecting and Birth Parent Support Fund, and how it helped her during her pregnancy and after she gave birth.

The top finisher completed the 3.1 miles in under 19 minutes – while two others came close finishing shortly after. Family and friends of all participants were waiting at the finish line cheering on their loved ones.

We concluded the day by selecting raffle winners and presenting awards to the top finishers in each age category. Overall top male and female received an entry to Philadelphia's Color Run.



This year's Find Her Footing 5K raised over \$6,500 for the Fund. About 1/3 of AFTH's birthparents are parenting other children and may be struggling to secure basic needs. AFTH created the Expecting and Birth Parent Support Fund to provide financial assistance to help birthparents get back on their feet.

We cannot wait until next year's Find Her Footing 5k.

## **Recent Legislation**

**FEDERAL** - H. Res. 41 – Supporting a uniform adoption process for foster youth - in 2005, the Uniform Laws Commission designated the Adoption Act from 1994 as a model rather than a uniform law keeping State adoption policies varied and incongruent. The Interstate Compact for the Placement of Children has only been enacted by 9 States and cannot be considered nationally in effect until passed by 35 States. There is a need for coordination between ICPC, the Interstate Compact for Juveniles, the Interstate Compact on Adoption and Medical Assistance and other compacts affecting the placement of and which provide services to children. The Federal Government should provide for a State's continuing legal jurisdiction and responsibility for placement and care of a child that it would have had if the placement were intrastate. If approved this would create a more uniform process across states and promote the adoption of more children within the US.

**NEW JERSEY** - On Jan. 1 2017, under a law signed by Gov. Chris Christie in 2014, the records of some 300,000 adopted persons will be unsealed. By Dec. 31, a birth parent must have complete forms with the state Department of Health if she or he wants information redacted from the birth certificate.

**INDIANA** - HB 1245 authored by Rep Michael Karickhoff grants a notice of adoption to grandparents. This bill if passed would provide that a grandparent of a child sought to be adopted is entitled to notice of pending adoption proceedings.

SB 332 authored by Sen. Joseph Zakas & Sen. Rodric Bray amends provisions regarding adoption notices. Provides that a consent to an adoption is not required from the biological father of a child born out of wedlock who was conceived as a result of a crime in jurisdictions in which the elements of the crime are substantially similar to certain crimes under Indiana law. Amends provisions regarding: (1) when a putative father is not entitled to establish paternity; and (2) post adoption contact privileges. Prohibits any person from challenging an adoption decree after the expiration period.

## **Book Reviews**



**99 Adoption Do's and Don'ts** by Russell Elkins - This is a short book packed with a lot of great advice. In fact, we liked it so much that we have started giving this book out to our clients! This book is really geared toward adopting infants through open adoption directly from the hospital. The advice is easy to read, and the book is only about 50 pages long. These are things we really want all prospective adoptive parents to know.

**99 Things You Wish You Knew Before Choosing Adoption** by Roberta & Jeffrey Kasky - A quick read with some good information about legal risk, termination of parental rights and what expenses you can and can't pay for in regards to potential birth parents. Additionally, there is information on special needs adoptions, future contact agreements, and surrogacy as well. The authors completed their adoption in Florida so check with your agency or attorney for explanations on the specific laws in your state.





## **What Open Adoption Means**

Since Maxine Chalker started Adoptions From The Heart in 1985, the mission and goals of the organization have been focused on **open adoption.** AFTH emphasizes the importance of supporting everyone in the adoption triad. As an agency committed to these values, we wanted to share with you what open adoption means to AFTH staffers. You'll find that the staff expresses themes of love, respect, and compassion.

"I believe that open adoption is not just one point in time, but rather a gradual growth. In my experience, both parties are normally nervous/cautious/hesitant at first. Meeting anyone initially is always a new experience, and trust is not given but rather earned. Open adoption allows for both sides to connect, with the ability to gradually grow that relationship into something that best fits everyone's comfort level. The ultimate goal is for a child to grow up knowing his or her story, and having all these amazing people to love him or her."

"Openness means less doubt, less insecurity, and less questioning for the child, which in turn improves confidence and self esteem."

"I believe open adoption is the ultimate way for a mother to say "I love you more." To me, it says "I love you more than I may be able to show you. I love you more than my own peace of mind, and I will continue to love you more with each day I watch you grow with your adoptive family."

"Only the parts of the triad can have this journey together and believe in one another to make it work. I have had the privilege of watching families come together through open adoption for over 16 years. Open Adoption becomes a gift and not something scary or to hide from." "Open Adoption to me is a beautiful word for family! As a social worker, when counseling with all parts of the adoption triad, the explanation to my clients on open adoption is family, trust, dedication and loyalty.

They are embarking on a journey like no other where they have not only gained another family to love, but a friendship that will last a lifetime. This one child has brought two families together in a unique way."

"Open adoption means that our daughter, doesn't only have to hear how much her birthmother loves her and thinks about her but she can hear it directly from Momma Jess herself.

Open adoption means our family grew by many, not just one. It means, together we celebrate our diverse roles of motherhood in her life. It's about standing together in love for the same child."

An AFTH staff member, also an adoptive mother, always goes back to this Jody Landers quote when people ask what open adoption means to her.

"A child born to anOther wOman calls me mommy. The MAGNITUDE of that tragedy and DEPTH of that privilege are not lost on me."

"Open adoption is not about getting what *you* want. It's about committing yourself to a life-long relationship each and every day for the sake of your child. It's about honoring the commitment you made to your child's birthparents when they choose you to raise their child."



## **Domestic Program Update**

We welcome all AFTH families (domestic and international) to join us in celebration at our annual summer picnics. We encourage all of our waiting families to attend their office's support group. Our offices also offer support groups and one-on-one support for birthparents during and after placement. We believe connecting with other men and women who have chosen adoption is important. Contact your social worker or visit www.afth.org/calendar for upcoming support groups.

## **Calendar Year Statistics**

In 2016, AFTH placed 140 children into their forever homes. Last year, we placed 10 children with single adoptive parents and 16 children with same-sex couples. Again, AFTH has been awarded the HRC seal for our LGBTQ Cultural Competency.

As of April 1, 2017, 75% of AFTH families have been waiting less than 18 months and 56% less than a year.

Last year, more than half (55%) of our placements were emergencies. And we have seen that trend continue. So if you are a waiting family and are unsure of what to do in an emergency placement, contact your social worker so they can explain the process to help you feel more prepared. Additionally, make sure to talk with your social worker if at any point you are unable to change plans and travel to a hospital for a placement within 24 hours as you may need to go on hold.

# AFTH Waiting Family Support Groups

AFTH understands the waiting process can be hard. AFTH local offices host support groups for waiting families to come together to connect. Support groups are led by AFTH staff and cover a variety of topics designed for waiting families. Contact your office or visit our events calendar at <u>www.afth.org</u> for details.

# AFTH Birth Parent Support Groups

One of the most helpful healing tips that many birth parents have found is to connect to others who have gone through similar circumstances. Support groups bring together women who have made the difficult choice to place their child. This can bring a level of comfort, understanding and empathy that those who haven't personally placed a child are unable to truly provide. Call your local office for details.

## **International Adoption News**

AFTH prides itself on keeping abreast of news regarding inter-country adoption. We collaborate with agencies across the U.S. that do provide inter-country adoption placement services. AFTH is able to provide Home Studies, Education, Post-Adoption/Placement Reports and Services, and other assistance in support of international adoptions. #### **General International News**

If a U.S. Hague accredited agency or ASP (Adoption Service Provider) is debarred from operating, loses its accreditation or is suspended, it "must execute the plans required by 96.33(e) and 96.42 (d) of the Hague Convention under the oversight of the accrediting entity, and transfer its intercounty adoption cases and adoption records to other accredited agencies, approved persons, or a State archive, as appropriate." ### China

One of our transferred families whose log in date to China was 1/16/07 received an assignment through Carolina Adoption Services in December. The family, who worked through our Allentown Office, were matched with a three year old boy. For the past ten years, they have maintained their immigration clearances. This couple deserves our congratulations and respect for their tenacity and patience!

The number of Chinese children adopted by

foreigners has decreased by 80% in ten years. In 2005, 15,000 Chinese children were adopted internationally and in 2014, it dropped to only 2,800. Between 2004 and 2014 the number of children placed through intercountry adoption in 24 major countries dropped by 70%. The U.S. continues to be the world's largest internationally oriented adopters but those figures are rapidly declining from about 23,000 in 2004 to around 5,000 in 2014. It is still dropping to new lows.

### **Ethiopia** (Suspension of Adoptions)

On April 21, an official from Ethiopia's Ministry of Women and Children (MOWA) informed U.S. Embassy Addis Ababa that it is suspending its processing of intercountry adoption cases, effective immediately. The U.S. DOS does not yet know how long this suspension will last.

#### Ghana

On January 1, 2017, the Hague Convention entered into force for Ghana. After reviewing Ghana's Amended Children's Act of 2016, and confirming the establishment of Ghana's Central Authority, the United States has determined it will now be able to issue Hague Adoption Certificates for adoptions from Ghana. The DOS cautions U.S. adoptive parents that there may be delays in the adoption process while Ghana works to implement its new adoption laws, regulations and procedures.

### Guatemala

Guatemala requests missing post placement reports. On 1/12/17 the state.gov website issued a reminder to ASPs and adoptive parents that Guatemala requires



post-adoption reports for cases processed under the National Adoption Council's (CAN) Acuerdo process. The Acuerdo is the process under which certain transition cases are processed.

### The Kyrgyz Republic

Adoptions from Kyrgyz will begin under the Hague Adoption Convention on 11/1/16. Currently only adoptions to the United States are possible.

#### Russia

A provisional ruling from Europe's human rights court has ordered Russia to pay damages and legal costs to Americans who were barred from adopting Russian children. Russian has three months to appeal the decision.

The case was brought by 45 Americans who had been in the final stages of the adoption procedure when Russia banned Americans from adopting.

A court press release indicated it awarded \$3,180 in damages to each pair of prospective parents plus \$600 in legal costs.

#### Sierra Leone

The U.S. Embassy in Freetown confirmed with Sierra Leone's Ministry of Social Welfare, Gender and Children's Affairs (MSWGCA) that the MSWGCA has not authorized or designated any

particular individual or individuals to facilitate adoptions from Sierra Leone. The Embassy also confirmed there are many adoption service providers registered in Sierra Leone and working directly with MSWGCA. Prospective adoptive parents seeking information about accredited ASPs with Sierra Leone adoption programs may wish to review the Council on Accreditation's (COA) website, which has a search function.
